### **Quarter 2/3 & report card information:**

- Quarter #2 wraps up on Thursday, January 27<sup>th</sup>, 2022 – **please check-in with your child(ren) to make sure they are on top of their assignments.**
- Grade 12 Literacy Assessment required for graduation: Thursday, Jan 27<sup>th</sup> at 9am.  
**\*\* If a student has a conflict with another class/exam, they will need to check in with Miss Thompson or Mr. Ryan**
- \*\* Note that the grade 10 Literacy and Numeracy assessments will be scheduled for April and June

### **Quarter #4:**

In 2022 our Outdoor Ed and Kayaking 11/12 Program at USS will be offered as a full-time program in Quarter 4. This will be a unique outdoor education opportunity for our grade 11 and 12 students. The students will have the opportunity to earn 16 credits throughout Quarter 4: Outdoor Education 11 and Outdoor Education 12, Kayaking 11, and Kayaking 12. This is 8 more credits (two extra courses) than most students receive in a quarter.

The course will focus on safety, team building, leadership, environmental stewardship, trip planning, marine sciences, local First Nations cultural & community connection and outdoor skills such as wilderness first aid, VHF radio use, weather, navigation/orienteering, surviving & thriving outdoors, and effective communication. Students will receive instruction in stand-up paddle boarding, surfing, hiking, kayaking, and canoeing, with a potential for other opportunities. Students will also participate in several courses, where upon successful completion they can earn certification in 40-hour Wilderness First Aid, CPR-C, Paddle Canada Level 1 Kayaking and Canoeing, Sea Kayaking Guides Alliance of BC Level 1 Guide and Radio Operator Certificate (Maritime).

### **School Survey, Code of Conduct, & Lockers:**

Staff has also been spending quite some time on revising our Code of Conduct with the intention of bringing this to students in the near future. Having student voice embedded within our Code of Conduct is essential in continuing to build and maintain a holistic, reflective, and supportive environment.

One of the items that came out clearly in the student survey is the desire to bring back lockers. Therefore, starting in our 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter lockers will be available to students on a first come first serve basis. Locks can be purchased for \$5 through the school or students can bring in their own lock from home. As well, students and family need to complete the Conditions of Use agreement that will be sent home with students during the first week of 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter.
