## **Please consider the following start up details as we start our new school year:**

- Arrival and Departure protocol: we ask that students stay near their classrooms when they arrive in the morning and practice social distancing where they can. When leaving the school grounds our bus students will be asked to line up at our staging area and will be called to board the bus when we are ready.
- Mask wearing currently is optional and is a choice of families and students. Any student who asks for a mask will be given one. We will ask student to wash their hands or hand sanitize as they transition into class in the morning, after recess, and after lunch play time. Students will be expected to use positive respiratory etiquette and sneeze or cough into their elbow.
- We ask that families complete the daily health check, and please stay home if sick.
- If your child is late, please have them come to the main office to sign in. All students leaving early will need to sign out at the office. We ask all visitors to come to the office to check in.
- Your child will bring home a package of important forms next week. Thank you for reading, updating, and returning the forms to your child's teacher as soon as possible.

## WHENEVER YOU VISIT THE SCHOOL

To ensure the safety of our students and to minimize the disruption to classes **please check in at the office** whenever you visit the school for whatever reason. Please come to the main office and Mrs. Behnke, Mr. Brown, or Mrs. Fryer will be able to help you. Anything to be delivered to a student can be taken can be dropped off at the office and we will deliver to the classroom. If you are picking up your child for an appointment, please make arrangements ahead of time with your child's classroom teacher. Or if it is needed, please come to the office and we will help connect you to your child. If your child is leaving early for the day, we ask that you come to the office to sign them out.

## LUNCH PROGRAM

John Howitt has a limited number of lunches available to students starting Monday September 12<sup>th</sup>. Students require a parent or guardian to complete and sign a lunch program envelope for each month. Envelopes are available at the office. ### SIGN IN/OUT:

If your child is late coming to school, please ask them to come to the office to sign in. We will then help to connect them to their class. If your child needs to leave early, please let us know ahead of time and we will work to have them ready. Any student leaving early for the day will need to be signed out by a parent or guardian, or other approved adult.

## IMPORTANT SCHEDULES

### SCHOOL HOURS

**Our school day starts at 8:40am. Dismissal time is 2:26 pm.** We ask that you keep your child(ren) home until at least **8:25 am** since that is when the teachers begin their supervision duty.

First recess is at **10:10 am to 10:25 am** (Intermediate classes: Mrs. Mayes, Miss. Jeffery, Ms. Dyer, and Mr. Carey) and we have a second recess from **10:25 am to 10:40 am** (Primary classes: Mrs. Koszegi, Mrs. Davidson, Mrs. Miller, Mrs. Hahn, and Ms. Lenormand). We urge all children to go outside at these breaks for fresh air and a stretch. Children should be prepared with appropriate dress for the changing weather during the recess breaks. As you are aware, temperatures and conditions can vary greatly from morning to afternoon here in the valley.

Our lunch hour is from **12:00 noon to 12:35 pm**. Children play outdoors for the 35 minutes and then eat their lunch once back in class with their teachers.

**Students will be playing outside for recess and lunch every day. Please send waterproof coats or raincoats, umbrellas, boots, and warm clothing. This will be very important this year! We believe in "Being in Nature" and learning outdoors. Daily Physical Activity is part of our curriculum.**

### HOMEWORK FOR PARENTS: INFO UPDATE

We will be sending home ***Demographic Verifier forms*** for all students next week. The 2-sided form shows the information we have on file for your children. Please check it over carefully, make any changes or corrections on the form and sign it in the appropriate area. Please have your child ***return the signed form to their teacher even if there are no changes.***



**Student Emergency Preparedness Release Form:** This form will have very important information for us in the event of an emergency like whom can we send your child(ren) in the event we cannot reach you or you cannot get to the school.

**Comfort Kit:** Each class will have a bin stored in the large container on the back field of our school, again, in the event of an emergency. If you have not completed a comfort pack, please send it in ASAP! If you need assistance with the content, please call the school.

**Privacy Consent Form:** Initial to grant permission as indicated on form.

**Indigenous Self-Identification Form:** is a form for families to consider for their students. Following the Ministry of Education guidelines, we send this home each year. If you have questions, please contact Mr. Brown or Mrs. Fryer at the school.

**BC School Fruit and Vegetable Program:** Fruits and vegetables are supplied **free for all students** to encourage healthy eating. Please fill in the form if your child has an allergy, we need to be aware of, or if you do not want your child to participate.

## KEEPING OUR STUDENTS SAFE

### STUDENT SAFETY

Safety has been and continues to be a number one priority at John Howitt. Over the last few years, the safety committee worked on a safe drop-off and pick-up procedure, before and after school. Please note the following directions and follow the traffic flow patterns.

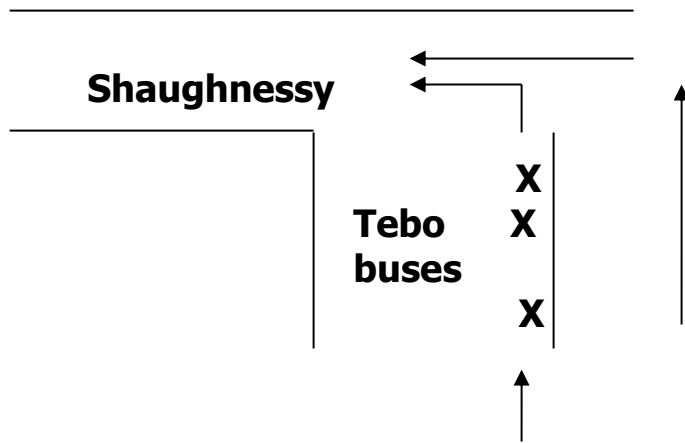
### SCHOOL DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP:

To ensure that all our students are safe at the beginning and end of the school day, we are asking you to respect the **BUS LOOP ZONE** at the paved west end of the school. **The only vehicles that have access to this area besides buses and day-care vans are those that are transporting students who have special physical needs.**

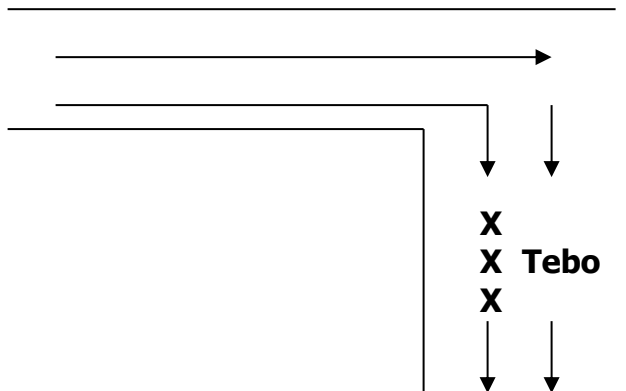
To ensure student safety at the beginning and end of the day, we ask that those of you who are approaching the school from the South on Tebo continue along Shaughnessy after you have dropped off or picked up your child. Similarly, if you are approaching the school from Shaughnessy, we ask that you continue along Tebo for a block before turning for your return home. These plans avoid the need for turning around at the end of Tebo, a practice that has caused congestion in the past and threatened the safety of our children. **Simply put - PLEASE, NO 'U' TURNS near the school.**

**Parents follow the route our buses take, Tebo – Shaughnessy, preventing the second trip through the crossing area.**





**Parents parked on the opposite side of the street, please approach via Shaughnessy.**



**This prevents turning at the end and doubling back through the crossing.**

In addition: Kindergarten parents are asked to back into the kindergarten parking spaces prior to dismissal time so that you can leave facing front to allow you maximum visibility of arriving and departing older students.

Similarly, we ask that any parent using the main staff parking lot to also **back in** to maximize visibility and safety of students. We also ask that you leave "Staff" designated parking spaces for the staff only. Many arrive and leave with large bundles of classroom business each day.



We thank you for your cooperation and understanding in this matter as we all work together for the safety of our students.

## REMINDER FROM THE RCMP

The RCMP will be enforcing all motor vehicle infractions within school zones, and would like to remind drivers of the following common concerns

- Vehicle speed is 30 km/hr. within all school zones. The school zone speed limit on Tebo changed last year and was expanded to please watch for the sign.
- Vehicles **cannot** park within 6 meters of any traffic control device, cross walk or stop sign
- Reminder to come to a complete stop at all stop signs.
