STUDENT LEARNING SURVEY: GRADE 4 & GRADE 7 FAMILIES:

The Pacific Rim School District, and John Howitt Elementary, is participating in the 2025 Ministry of Education Electronic Anonymous Student Learning Survey Project in cooperation with all other school districts throughout the province. Parents/Guardians/Caregivers of Grade 4 and 7 students can complete the online Anonymous Student Learning Surveys. The deadline to complete the survey has been extended to May 9th, 2025.



To complete the survey:

- 1. Go to any computer, phone, or tablet that has an updated internet browser access at home, work, or school.
- 2. Go to www.bced.gov.bc.ca/sat survey/access.htm
- 3. Under the section *Direct Access no logon number required* select:
 - a. District: the name of your child's district (SD 70 Alberni)
 - b. School: the name of your child's school (John Howitt Elementary)
 - c. Language: the language of your choice
- 4. Complete the survey by clicking on the appropriate circle to answer each question. Move to the next set of questions by clicking on the right arrow in the bottom right corner of the screen. Click on the left arrow to navigate backwards.
- 5. When you are finished with the survey, you will get a message "Thank you for sharing your views".
- 6. Once complete, your school will have the results immediately.

Athletes should come to training and games in athletic wear with runners or plastic cleats. No metal cleats, please! For both flag and contact rugby, athletes are asked to remove all jewelry or sharp clothing. For contact rugby, mouthguards and explicit training on how to tackle and be tackled safely will be provided.

Students in Grades 6 and 7 will be trained in how to play full-contact rugby and given the option to play contact or flag on gamedays.

Students will need to arrange their own transportation to and from the Hub training site, and to the Black Sheep Rugby Club on game days.

EXPECTATIONS WHEN STUDENTS ARE ON THE SCHOOL BUS:

- The bus driver is always in charge.
- Eating or drinking are not permitted on the bus.
- Students should take their seat promptly and sit properly, always facing forward.
- Students must remain seated while the bus is in motion and are not permitted to face backwards or sit partially in the aisle of the bus. Students are not permitted to change seats or stand while the bus is in motion.



- Students must always conduct themselves in an acceptable manner. Profanity, obscene gestures, horseplay, throwing objects, fighting, and boisterous or other improper conduct will not be tolerated.
- The aisle and emergency exits of the bus must be always kept clear.
- Leaving waste or other rubbish on the floor or throwing it from the windows of the bus is not permitted.
- Extending arms or head out of the bus windows is extremely dangerous and is not permitted.
- Only eligible riders will be allowed access to their assigned school bus and will disembark at their designated school or regular bus stop only. Elementary students wishing to disembark at an undesignated bus stop (i.e. play date) must have a note signed by a parent/guardian.
- Students should be at the bus stop five (5) minutes before the scheduled pick-up time; the bus will not wait for those who are late.
- Students must stay in bus loading zones while waiting and will load and unload the bus in an orderly manner.
- After getting off the bus, Students are not to walk or stand near or beside the bus.
 Crossing the road must be done in front of the bus and when crossing, Students need to watch for vehicles

not stopping and be prepared to avoid vehicles. Students should not use cellular phones or headphones/electronic devices during the loading or unloading process. Crossing behind the bus is not permitted.

- If the bus does not arrive within 20 minutes of the scheduled time students should return home.
- Any instances of bullying or inappropriate behavior should be reported to the bus driver.
- Damage to the bus or equipment should be reported to the driver. Deliberate damage to a school bus by a student will result in consequences (i.e. bus suspension) and costs to repair the damage (e.g. seat covers)
- Students are not allowed to sit in the driver's seat or touch any switches or controls of the bus.
- Students may not have anything in their possession that may cause injury to anyone else on the bus.
- Student cell phone use for pictures/videos, music, lighting or any other use that may distract the bus driver is not permitted on the bus. Music with inappropriate content is not permitted on the school bus.
- Bus pass cards are mandatory and must be scanned on and off the bus. A \$10 replacement fee applies to all lost or broken cards.
