

It is a privilege to participate in extra-curricular activities at Ucluelet Secindary School (USS). Representation of USS carries with it specific expectations beyond those outlined in the Student Code of Conduct and BC School Sports. Accordingly, students agree to adhere to the following school expectations and BC School Sports Code of Ethics. Violations will result in consequences as determined appropriate by the coach, athletic director, school administration or any combination of the three.

## To participate in extra-curricular activities, the student will adhere to the following:

- 1. Work to the best of his/her abilities in all courses (good academic standing).
- 2. Maintain satisfactory attendance, positive citizenship and good sportsmanship.
- 3. Request permission from teachers for absences due to extra-curricular activities and obtain and complete all missed assignments.
- 4. Maintain a respectful manner both on and off school premises.
- 5. Abide by all team/club rules regarding appearance (dress code).
- 6. Travel with the team/club to and from games/events, unless special arrangements have been made with the coach, parent and administrator.
- 7. Be responsible and respectful for all school equipment and/or uniforms assigned. <u>All items will be</u> returned in full and in good condition.
- 8. Attend all practices, meetings, rehearsals and games unless previously negotiated with coach/sponsor.
- 9. Report all injuries or illnesses especially those resulting from extra-curricular activities.
- 10. Refrain from inappropriate behavior such as bullying, fighting, technology misuse and theft.
- 11. Not engage in drug or alcohol use at any time during curricular or extra-curricular activities. This includes smoking and vaping.
- 12. Use the internet and social media in a positive manner. Follow rules for good behaviour and respectful conduct online and offline.
- 13. Refrain from online activities intended to harm (physically or emotionally) another person.
- 14. Avoid posting photographs or images that are inappropriate, unethical and that you wouldn't want parents, teachers, coaches, employers or teammates to see.
- 15. Not engage in academic dishonesty in the form of plagiarism and/or cheating.

BC School Sports is committed to a safe and positive environment within its programs, activities and events, by making all individuals aware that there is at all times an expectation of appropriate behaviour that is consistent with the values of BC School Sports. BC School sports, and USS consider it to be a privilege to represent your school in athletic competition. Therefore, student athletes are expected to uphold the following BC School Sports standards:

411.1 Treat all participants fairly regardless of gender, race, sexual orientation, religion, physical or mental abilities, political belief or economic status.

411.2 Embrace the highest ideals of sportsmanship, ethical conduct and fair play. Be modest in victory and gracious in defeat.

411.4 Uphold rules of the sport, spirit of such rules and encourage other athletes to do the same.

411.5 Represent yourself, your parents, your school and your community with proper conduct at all times on and off the playing field/court

411.6 Respect other athletes' dignity and acknowledge that verbal or physical behaviour that constitutes harassment or abuse in unacceptable.

411.7 Participate in a manner that ensures the safety of fans, athletes, coaches and officials. 411.8 Accept decisions of officials without dispute.

411.9 Shall not use the media, social media or networking forums to criticize or threaten other student-athlets, coaches, officials, school teams, spectators or BCSS.

411.10 Demonstrate that it is a privilege to represent your school.

## **Consequences**

There will be no participation of any form during suspensions. Upon completion of a suspension, a meeting with the Athletic Director and/or Administration must happen before participation of any sort will be granted.

In addition, the following will apply to the drug and alcohol policy.

A violation of this policy will result in the following extra-curricular consequences:

First infraction:	-	Immediate suspension from the current team/club
	-	An additional 5 school days upon return of school suspension
	-	Meeting with those described above before re-instatement
Second Infraction:	-	Suspension from extra-curricular participation for 90 calendar days
	-	Meeting with those described above before re-instatement
Third Infraction: suspension the entire	- follov	Immediate suspension from team for remainder of season as well as ving school year from extra-curricular participation. Meeting with those

described above to review and discuss re-instatement opportunities if any.
