Superintendent's Report March 2, 2021

Changes to COVID19 Health and Safety Guidelines

Revisions to COVID19 Health and Safety Guidelines have been completed and posted to the SD70 website, and schools have completed and submitted the new Health and Safety Checklist to the District office. These changes were part of revisions to Ministry of Education/BCCDC Guidelines for Schools announced earlier in February.

A Year of COVID19

As we look forward to Spring Break, it is hard not to reflect on where we were 12 months ago and how our personal and professional lives since Spring Break 2020 have not been the same. And it is still not the same: for students, for parents, for schools, for communities. I remain impressed by the resilience of students and staff and how we have attempted to carry on with an educational agenda in the face of many social, emotional, mental health challenges. Attention to social and emotional learning and students' mental health and well-being continue to demand our attention and I am impressed with the systems compassion and commitment to supporting learners during COVID19 times.

The most noticeable difference in schools is the emphasis on in-person learning and use of various systems, structures, and routines to make a student's school life as normal as possible. What cannot be understated, however, is a concern for students who remain out of school since last March and for some of our earliest learners who have yet to experience intentional early learning opportunities that help prepare them for kindergarten entry. It's not just a loss of contact with learning but also a loss of contact with each other and the corresponding impact on our social and emotional growth.

In the upcoming weeks, conversations with schools and with partners will focus on identifying students for whom additional support or services may be necessary to see these students successfully conclude the 2020/21 school year. Central to these conversations will be how to best spend remaining Federal COVID19 monies knowing that it is one time funding unlikely to re-appear next school year.
