



### Egg Drop Challenge

We will be hosting our annual **Egg Drop Challenge** on **Thursday, March 14<sup>th</sup>** from 9:00 am –12:00 pm. For this challenge, students are encouraged to design a device or container that securely holds an **uncooked egg**. This container will be dropped from a tall height and the challenge is to attempt to keep the raw egg safe, without cracking or breaking.

#### Rules for this contest consist of:

1. Containers must stay within the size of 15cm x 30cm (approximately the size of a 4L jug)
2. For fun ~ name your egg or egg container (**be creative!**)
3. Use a **raw chicken egg**
4. Eggs must be able to be removed to check for breakage (do not glue it to anything)
5. Do not fill contraptions with anything liquid or messy (water, gel, jello, slime etc.) This makes it very difficult to clean up.
6. Staff will drop the containers from the outside back stairs landing.
7. All egg containers (and eggs) will be stored in the student's classroom on **March 14<sup>th</sup>**. Students will need to keep their containers with them in their classroom until their class egg drop time (see below).

If parents would like to watch, we request parent spectators view the egg drop from the fence along Short Street at the back of the school yard.

After the event, any eggs that were not cracked or broken will be kept in the classroom with the teacher in a safe location and returned home after school.
