## Message from the Principal...

Our return to school this January has already been filled with excitement, and we are only 3 weeks in! Basketball season has started for our grade 6 & 7 students, with practices and games well underway. We had several special visitors from the school board in our school last week. Both of our Superintendents and three Trustees spent time in various classrooms and learning about our school goals. They thoroughly enjoyed their time at Tsuma-as and had a great time visiting with students and staff. This week, our teachers extended their Professional Development in Literacy as they worked alongside Dr. Jennifer Kelly, a visiting Literacy expert and author. In other news, our grade 4 & 4/5 classes are preparing for the upcoming arrival of salmon eggs, which should be any day now! ## Kindergarten & New Student Registration

Student registration for the 2026-2027 school year opens February 2<sup>nd</sup>. If you have a child starting kindergarten in September (born in 2021) or if you know of any new students registering with our school, you can access registration packages online on the School District Website or you can visit our school office to pick up a paper package. Please note February 2<sup>nd</sup> registration is for students within catchment only. Out of catchment will not be considered until after February 28<sup>th</sup> when all in catchment students have been allocated to our school.

Starting Kindergarten is an important step. Registering early helps us prepare welcoming classrooms and supports.

Cross Boundary Requests

If you are an “Out of Catchment” family attending our school, you will need to complete the Out of Catchment request form annually. Is your child absent?

A friendly reminder for all families that it is important to make the school aware when your child is going to be absent from school. Please avoid calling the main school line. General Traffic Safety

Traffic at the front of our school can be VERY busy at drop-off and pick-up times. Unfortunately, the only crosswalk on Compton crosses at Margaret St. & Kitsuksis Rd (not in front of our school). We encourage all students and families who walk to school to use these crosswalks, but if you choose to drop your child off across from the school, please have a conversation with them about road safety. When crossing, they **NEED** to make eye contact with a driver to be sure they are seen before crossing. There have been a few close calls reported. Child safety is our number one priority.

Bus Safety

We are working closely with Dave Prevost from the bus garage to ensure our students are safe on school busses. SPOTLIGHT ON  
**LITERACY WEEK (JAN 26 – FEB 1)**

Tuesday January 27<sup>th</sup> is National Literacy Day. This year’s theme is “make family mealtime learning time.” We use our literacy skills in many parts of everyday life linked to mealtime: reading grocery prices, food packaging, menus and recipes.



**COOK TOGETHER**

Read recipes and prepare meals together. Find new recipes online or borrow a recipe book from the local library for inspiration.

**FAMILY GAME NIGHTS**

Stay at the table after mealtime and play board games or card games together. Games help children develop literacy, numeracy and social skills.

**MEALTIME**

Practice oral language and conversation skills by eating meals together when you can. Turn the screens off and focus on talking about the day and telling stories to one another.



## Rules For Bus Students



- The bus driver is always in charge.
- Eating or drinking are not permitted on the bus.
- Students should take their seat promptly and sit properly, always facing forward.
- Students must remain seated while the bus is in motion and are not permitted to face backwards or sit partially in the aisle of the bus. Students are not permitted to change seats or stand while the bus is in motion.
- Students must conduct themselves in an acceptable manner, always. Profanity, obscene gestures, horseplay, throwing objects, fighting, and boisterous or other improper conduct will not be tolerated.
- The aisle and all emergency accesses of the bus must always be kept clear.
- Leaving waste or other rubbish on the floor or throwing it from the windows of the bus is not permitted.
- Extending arms or head out of the bus windows is extremely dangerous and is not permitted.
- Only eligible riders will be allowed access to their assigned school bus and will disembark at their designated school or regular bus stop only. Elementary students wishing to disembark at an undesignated bus stop (i.e. play date) must have a note signed by a parent/guardian.
- Students should be at the bus stop five (5) minutes before the scheduled pick-up time; the bus will not wait for those who are late.
- Students must stay in bus loading zones while waiting and will load and unload the bus in an orderly manner.
- After getting off the bus, Students are not to walk or stand near or beside the bus. Crossing the road must be done in front of the bus and when crossing, Students need to watch for vehicles not stopping and be prepared to avoid vehicles. Students should not use cellular phones or headphones/electronic devices during the loading or unloading process. Crossing behind the bus is not permitted.
- If the bus does not arrive within 20 minutes of the scheduled time students should return home.
- Any instances of bullying or inappropriate behaviour should be reported to the bus driver.
- Damage to the bus or equipment should be reported to the driver.
- Students are not allowed to sit in the driver's seat or touch any switches or controls of the bus.
- Students may not have anything in their possession that may cause injury to anyone else on the bus.
- Student cell phone use for pictures/videos, music, lighting, or any other use that may be distracting to the bus driver is not permitted on the bus. Music with inappropriate content is not permitted on the school bus.
