



XXX: STUDENT SUBSTANCE ABUSE AND POSSESSION(P)

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POLICY STATEMENT

The Board of Education is committed to ensuring that all students have access to safe, healthy, and inclusive learning environments, free from the impacts of substance abuse.

The possession, abuse, or distribution of alcohol, cannabis, vaping products, or illegal substances is prohibited on all school property, at school-sponsored events, and during any school-related activities.

Recognizing that substance abuse is a complex health and social issue, the Board promotes a balanced approach that emphasizes prevention, education and intervention. The focus is on supporting student well-being rather than punitive measures.

Purpose

This policy aims to:

- Promote health, safety, and well-being for all students and staff.
- Provide guidance for prevention, intervention, and support related to substance use.
- Encourage education and open communication to reduce stigma and support informed decision-making.
- Align with current legislation and provincial guidelines regarding underage substance use.
- Foster collaboration among schools, families, and community partners to address and respond to substance use concerns.

Commitment

The Board of Education values a supportive and restorative approach when responding to student substance use. Schools will prioritize connection, education, and access to appropriate resources and supports.
